

DISTRIBUTION IN JHUMRA TOWN

Jhumra is a very old town of the district Faisalabad. With the population of approximately 200,000 people it is situated in the east side of the district Faisalabad. As the recent monsoon and flood where affected the millions of people directly there are thousands of people who are directly affected by the heavy rains only. The maximum population of Ghumra town is living in villages, and in villages the people live in mud houses and mostly these homes affected by heavy rains. The Harmony Foundation's staff visited the town to find out the disabled people and brick kiln workers who were genuinely in need and for the need assessment of the people of the area who were affected by the heavy monsoon rains and identified their need the food and some of them tents on emergency basis, so after assessment we decided to help out the 80 families of brick kiln and disabled people.

MAJOR OCCUPATIONS

The majority of the people of the area are brick kiln workers and working from morning till evening to earn daily wages. These people are too much affected by the rains because the brick kiln factories closed in rainy seasons and during this all season these workers are without job. They have no other way for earning so they spend their lives in this season from hand to mouth but the recent monsoon not only unemployed them but also damaged their houses, so these people were compelled to take loan from the brick kiln owners.

The people of the area are also engaged with the other occupations also like power looms workers and farmers also.

HOW DID WE IDENTIFY THE AREA AND OUR KEY PERSONS

The staff members of the Harmony Foundation visited the area and met with the Catholic Parish Priest Father Patrick Yousaf. Father Patirck was in regular contact with the needy families and he helped us identify the disabled peoples' families. Parish priest helped us not only in preparing the list but he also provided the place for the distribution.

METHOD OF DISTRIBUTION

- First of all we visited the area and selected the specific area from where we chose the 80 most needy and deserving families of brick kiln workers and disabled people
- We make a list of the families and verified them
- After verification in their homes we issued them a token and told them the date and place of the distribution

ITEMS DISTRIBUTED:

The food stuff was consisted of milk, sugar, cooking oil, rice, pulses, white grams, Tea, Dry milk, Salt, onion, turmeric, chilies, mix masala, Tea,

The non-food stuff consisted of utensils, mosquito nets, floor mattresses, hand towels, bath soap, dish bar, biscuits
